Morgan Freeman: You know, I had a long way to go, given where I came from... I grew up in a small rural town in Mississippi. In fact, I headed to Hollywood very early on, when I was in my twenties. I was young and rather naively convinced that it would be quite easy to become an actor. I went to San Francisco and later to New York, where I got my first job in the theatre. It took me some time to come back to Hollywood and establish myself in the movie.

MF : Never. I had my difficult moments but so does everyone. If you go around Los Angeles and ask people what they do, you'll find that half of the bar maids, waiters, delivery guys etc. are aspiring actors, waiting for that big break.

3. _____

MF: Yes. After all these years, I feel that early Hollywood letdown was a blessing in disguise... Just look at history of some people who became hugely successful. In show business when they were very young. Mostly, they're gone. Either dead, or out of it! Fame is an incredible weight... and, if you are not psychologically prepared – as it is often the case with many of those youngsters – it's almost impossible not to let it go to your head.

MF: I've watched some of them... But I can hardly ever sit through the whole thing. I get annoyed because I see every single wrong move I made on screen. By the time I get to the third "watch," I've just about managed to look at the whole movie ...

MF: Since I've been in the movies, I've become aware of the fact that I can't trust the audience.... As far as I'm concerned, that's the main difference between filmmaking and the theater. Onstage, I see myself in the audience's reaction – to my mind, they're a reflection of quality of my work and, as the response is generally good I tend to walk away from the theater, feeling truly brilliant.... My biggest fear is that someday the audience is going to open its eyes and realize how bad my acting is.

MF: First of all I'm extremely flattered to have been asked to play such an eminent figure. Particularly in ... that Mr. Mandela picked me himself... plus, to direct it, we are going to have one of the best filmmaking around – Shekhar Kapur (*Elizabeth*), so I'm really looking forward to it!

MF: To tell you the truth, I never think of acting as a challenge... Basically, it's about studying the character and learning the lines. In fact, what's really hard is to cast what you, yourself, represent aside... I'm a typical American. It's very difficult for an American actor to play a non-American character.

I just hope he won't change his mind once he gets to know me better... This role will be exceptional in many ways. Generally speaking, I don't do any research at all. What's going to be very important is... clothing, makeup, and any physical aspects of the character.

MYOCARDITIS

A doctor will suspect you have myocarditis if you have a viral-like illness, followed shortly by congestive heart failure. If a 25-year-old healthy male had a respiratory illness three weeks ago, and now comes in with symptoms of heart failure – he is short of breath, fatigued, he has a rapid pulse and an enlarged heart, and his cardiovascular tests are abnormal – he may have myocarditis, even if we can't identify a virus or bacteria. Usually, there's no heart pain with myocarditis alone, but the infection is often accompanied by pericarditis, a painful inflammation of the membrane surrounding the heart.

The primary treatment is directed at controlling heart failure, unless the specific cause is known. That usually means bed rest and drugs to reduce fluid buildup, inflammation and pain and to maintain blood pressure and proper heart rhythm.

If the myocarditis is mild or moderate, you may fully recover with no damage to your heart. You can do whatever you want. Your limitations are determined by how you feel. The more physically fit you were before the infection, the better off you'll be after you recover.

Myocarditis is an inflammation of the heart muscle itself. Inflammation is a by-product of the immune system reacting to a foreign substance or even to the body itself. The Coxsackie virus is the most common known cause. But most of the time it is not known for sure what causes myocarditis. And it's very difficult to diagnose. Probably there are many who get it without being diagnosed.

There are no specific people prone to myocarditis, outside of people with weak immune systems. Young people, old people, middle-aged people- are all susceptible. There are no preventive measures you can take.
